Attention is paid to the general theological and liturgical practices in Geneva, to the roles played by parents and ministers, godparents and midwives, and to the many cases in which the ministers' agenda collided with traditional practices, family honor and expectations, and existing social networks.

The often untidy and incomplete process of reforming baptismal practice in Geneva is aptly described by Spierling as "negotiation." A fine example is Calvin's retention of godparents. It would seem odd for Calvin to retain a practice not found in scripture and freighted with the Roman Catholic doctrine of spiritual kinship, but he did so. He himself served as godfather to Genevan children on nearly fifty occasions. Spierling nicely details how Calvin reinvented the office of godparent in the formation of children in the faith, and how his designs were inconsistently replicated among the populace of Geneva.
