Schools operating in Michigan and receiving Title IV benefits from the U.S. Department of Education operate under regulations set forth both by the state and the federal government. Retention rate:

WTS has a retention rate of 89.4%.

Completion Rate:

Of the school's graduates in 2022, 15% of M.Div. graduates completed their degree in 3 years, 19% completed the degree in 4 years, and 42% in 5–6 years. 68% of our M.A. graduates completed the degree in 2-3 years, 68% of our D.Min. graduates completed the degree in 4-6 years, and 50% of our Th.M. candidates completed the degree in less than 2 years.

Placement:

Western Theological Seminary works with graduates in pursuing placement. Graduates seek calls in parish ministry, chaplaincy, social work, non-profit organizations and church administration. While the process may take some time, a very high percent of our students find placements where they feel God is calling them.

Of the 2021-2022 M.Div. graduates, 65.4% of those seeking employment were placed in part or full-time positions in their field within 7 months of graduation.

Peer to Peer File Sharing and Copyright Information

WTS has a policy regarding file sharing and copyright information which is included in our handbook. Copying should be consistent with the Copyright Act of 1976, available at www.copyright.gov. Copyright law necessitates that routine distribution of copyrighted material requires permission, copyright ownership or that the material be in the public domain. This includes distribution in paper format, electronically or by mounting material on a web page. In order to comply with copyright guidelines no copyrighted materials will be distributed within a classroom, chapel or other seminary activity without copyright compliance clearance. Before each semester the library staff will request citations for materials to be included in course material. Hymns distributed in chapel must be covered by the seminary's licenses or have permission of the publisher for use. Section 110 requires that videos and other dramatic performances be restricted to classroom settings as part of a systematic course of instruction or religious services. Copyright clearance for copying legally protected material is coordinated through the receptionist. The unauthorized distribution of copyrighted material may subject a student to civil and criminal liabilities.

Tuition Rate:

WTS's tuition rates have risen modestly over the last 3 years. The 2022-2023 increase was 4.8% for classes.
